# Minutes of the Weeting with Broomhill Ordinary Parish Council Meeting

### 5. DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS REPORT

#### 5.1 District Councillors Report

District Cllr R. Kybird:-

- Apologies were given on behalf of County Cllr Eagle who is unable to attend tonight's meeting.
- Weeting PC reported the "trod" was completed ahead of schedule and much welcomed by residents.
- Brandon rail sidings, Cllr Kybird was asked to comment with particular regard to dust, noise, hours of operation, lack of effective tyre washing. (This has since been done)
- Mobile food store was in Weeting last Friday (note December dates since advised as 2nd, 16th, 19<sup>th</sup> and 30th).
- Grimes Graves planning approval applauded, Cllr Kybird reported activity between the site manager and Norfolk Museums Service.
- Weeting PC advised that EH had erected scaffolding at Weeting Castle, but no works commenced and in fact the scaffold is enabling further vandalism.
- Kings Lynn Museum have an exhibition of West Norfolk coin hordes etc, with free winter entry. Ancient House in Thetford has a Vikings exhibition, note sunset entry fee £2 after 3Pm
- Bus service to West Suffolk College runs from Brandon via Thetford, Suffolk CC won't fund extension starting from Weeting, can Norfolk CC help with this?
- It was noted that there is continued issues with flooding at Saxon Place, due to concrete thickness, there is no easy solution, Steve James is aware.
- Cllr Kybird highlighted key items of cabinet meeting to be held at Swaffham including possible help for Parishes from Rural England prosperity funding.
- Local plan partial update is being considered for submission

### 6. MATTERS ARISING

# 6.1 Outstanding Highway Matters – to discuss any outstanding issues and to report any new issues

- The new trod has been installed and is being very well used by residents.
- We have a price for the safety mirror 45cm £39.69 and 60cm £54.59 for the junction of peppers close and Brandon Road, it was agreed that the Clerk would ask Westcotec if they can provide us with a cost for a post.
- The flashing light that was reported a few months back is still not working, the Clerk had been informed by Westcotec that there was nothing wrong with it, the Clerk will chase this up, this is on the Lynne road -corner of All Saints as you come in from Methwold.

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## 6.2 Playing Field/Open Spaces

- Jubilee Orchard update following meeting at Swaffham Cllr Childerhouse, Cllr Lister and the Clerk went to Swaffham to see their Orchard, Cllr Childerhouse who is not at the meeting tonight had sent a message to say that sourcing the trees for our orchard was all in hand.
- Oak Tree Outside the Bowls Club to discuss inspection and possible trimming back of the tree this tree may have a TPO on it, the Clerk will contact the Tree Officer at Breckland to come and have a look before any work is carried out.
- Cllr Lister said that we are having trouble getting a price for security door on the Parish Store, the Clerk is still waiting for the company to come back with a quote that previously fitted a door for us.
- Cllr Nordan is going to prepare a rota for Councillors for emptying the bins on the playing field.
- The Chair said that the barriers that stop the cars going on to the playing field are rotting, it was agreed that the clerk would take a look at prices for recycled plastic barriers (Cadell) to replace these that will not rot or need maintenance, also to look at making the barriers at the beginning of the dog walk into one long barrier between the play area and the dog walk.
- The Chair thanked everyone that helped to take down the fence around the play area.

# 6.3 Coronation Souvenirs – update on prices for proposed souvenirs for the children of Weeting and how to organize distribution of the souvenirs

Following a discussion, it was agreed that the Clerk would try and source book marks and these would be given to the children that attend the school in Weeting, Cllr Drewry said she will find out how many would be needed.

# **6.4** Christmas tree lighting – to discuss date to decorate the trees and gazebo Cllr Lister said that she and her husband and Cllr Murfet would be putting up the lights on the 18<sup>th</sup> November.
